




Best for barefoot chic

Far from staying in a shack, you'll love one of 38 charmingly rustic sea or garden view cottages close to Treasure Beach on Jamaica's south coast. The cottages come in a rainbow of colours and are decorated in a style that looks like it's influenced by Gaudi; think randomly embedded wine bottles, fragments of tiles in floors and walls and lots of curves. Throw in a swimming pool, tiny bar, Caribbean café where locals hang out, strip of sand and newly developed spa and you've got the perfect barefoot chic destination. What's more there's a great five-night honeymoon package, which includes accommodation in one of the three oceanfront Octopussy cottages complete with al fresco bathrooms (all the accommodation has cute names, like Starfish & Jellyfish and Sea Puss), a trip to the Pelican Bar (built by fisherman Floyd out of mangrove sticks a mile out to sea on a heavenly reef), trips to the mangroves of Alligator Hole and the Appleton Rum factory, dinner for two with wine, a half-hour massage each in the new holistic Driftwood Spa, breakfast in bed one morning and a bottle of wine on arrival.

X factor: Honeymoon Oceanfront cottage suite Octopussy 1, which is painted the colour of the Caribbean Sea, has a roof terrace and seriously dreamy al fresco bathroom.

Best for... relaxation

The twelve wooden cottages at Strawberry Hill on the rainforest slopes of the Blue Mountains make up one of the most remarkable resorts in the world. It's part of the Island Outpost Group, spearheaded by music mogul Chris Blackwell, who founded Island Records and introduced the world to Bob Marley. The place is steeped in musical history – Bob Marley wrote Natural Mystic and convalesced here after he was shot in the 70s.

Not that music is its only allure. Strawberry Hill's giant, hand-carved four-posters are the world's most comfortable beds which, combined with a touch of altitude, means you could be in danger of sleeping through your honeymoon! If you did, you'd miss out on nature walks, the Aveda Spa, infinity pool, and the colonial-style restaurant with oak bar decorated with photos of visiting stars like the Stones and Sinead O'Connor. The room's balconies have hammocks where you can lie and stare at the breathtaking mountain views, set 3100ft above the Caribbean Sea.

X factor: The heavenly beds!



The place to stay for 007 fans is Goldeneye, the gorgeous three-bedroom bungalow in Oracabessa on the north side of the island where Fleming penned all 17 Bond books. The swanky pad is now part of exclusive hotel group Island Outpost, owned by Chris Blackwell who founded Island Records, but you and your bride can still sit at Fleming's original desk and sip vodka martinis around his private pool.
